FAQ's

What does “Lectio Divina” mean?

Lectio Divina means divine reading. Since the early days of the Church, the Lectio has been used as a method to interact and engage with the scriptures. God's Word is living and active and sharper than any two-edged sword (Hebrews 4:12) and instructs our hearts in His way. A Lectio gives us the space, time and structure to make that possible.

What makes a Lectio Divina different from other types of journaling?

The Lectio Divina is all about LISTENING. Between each of the START segments, you read the scripture again SLOWLY... VERY SLOWLY... and if you can, read it out aloud. LISTEN for God's voice as you read it. An important part of a Lectio Divina, is the REST time. Some adults rest for up to 20 minutes. Some kids set their stopwatch for 5 minutes. Some groups decide to say, “The Lord's Prayer” together and then begin the REST time. How long you rest is up to you. You might start at a couple of minutes and increase your time. Have fun with it.

How can the MYSTART Journal be used in a group?

Lectios are used by individuals or in a group setting. Some ideas for using the journal in a group:

- Take turns reading the scripture before each section of the MYSTART Journal.
- Say the Lord's prayer together before the REST time.
- Enjoy sharing journal entries together at the end of the Lectio.

Penny's Short Stories - IDENTITY



"The Incredibles" is one of my favorite Disney Pixar movies. The story is of a family of superheroes who conceal their true identity and try to pretend to be normal people until their cover is blown and they get mixed up in a plot to overtake the world. The superheroes find it very difficult to pretend to be someone they aren't. Lots of people spend their lives trying to find out who they really are. They pretend their way through their lives and

miss out on the purpose they were created for. This quarter we are looking at Identity, discovering who we are and why God created us. Check out this journal entry by Mandy.

Hey there,
I'm Mandy.

I'm in Grade 5 and I love playing soccer. My dad is my coach and we train really hard. I hope one day to make it into one of the big tournaments. Every night my dad and I train together after school and then once a week we get together with the other team members for our scheduled training session. I wear a number on my back, but I'm not known by that number. My friends call me Mandy when they pass me the ball. The opposition team doesn't know my name. So they will call out, "Mark #10!" to their team. They will try anything to block me scoring a goal.

Last week we played the Hornets. They're a tough team. Ten minutes into the second half, I was dribbling the ball up the field and was getting ready to shoot a goal, when the opposition tackled me and started calling me names and telling me what a terrible player I was. The words hurt me. Everything in me wanted to walk off the field and kiss the game goodbye. But, then I heard my dad calling out from the sideline, "Get back up. It's time for another goal.

Remember who you are and what team you belong to. You're Mandy and you're a goal scorer. Let's Go!". That's all I needed to hear. When I heard my dad on the sideline yelling out his encouragement to me, I got back up and with renewed determination scored a goal.

On the way home my dad and I were talking about the game and I was saying how much I hate it when the opposing team tries to get me angry by pushing my buttons and getting me off my game. I said to him, that if he hadn't encouraged me from the sideline, I might have quit.

Dad said it reminded him of a bigger battle that is happening. God calls us by name and we belong to his team, but to the enemy we are just a number. He taunts us and teases us, trying to distract us and get us away from our purpose. But if we know who we are and whose team we are on, we can keep going knowing there's a grandstand of people who have gone before us cheering us on like the Bible says in Hebrews 12.

I know that the opposing teams are not going to stop trying to distract me, but I have my dad's voice in my ears, "Remember who you are and what team you belong to."

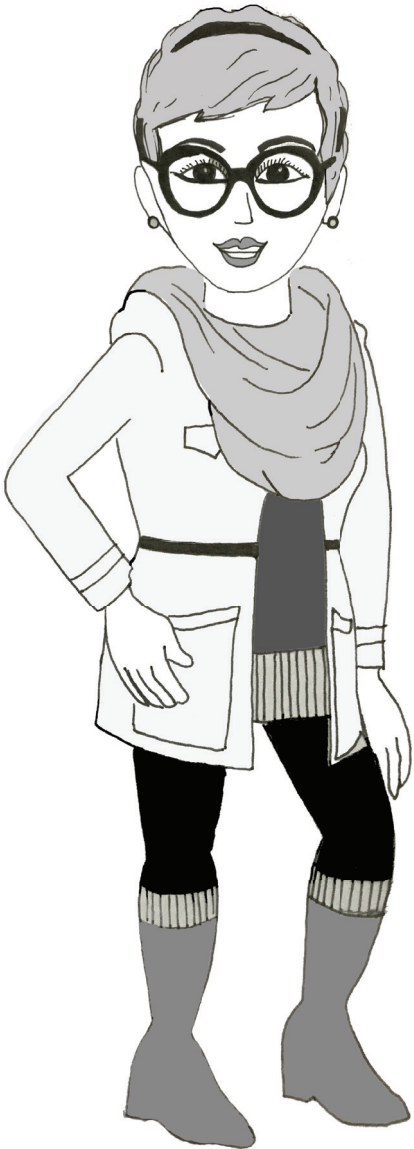
Mandy

David volunteered and offered to go out and fight the giant. King Saul decided to dress David up in his armor, but it didn't fit him, so he had to take it off.

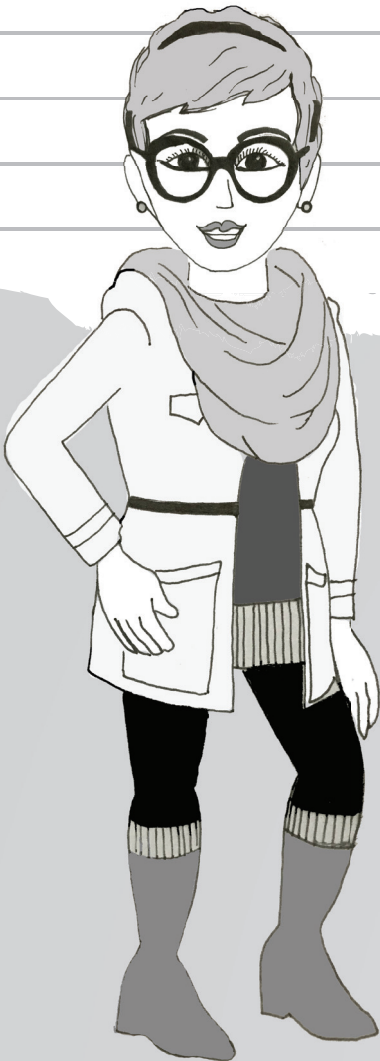

What was your favorite gift on your last birthday? One of my favorite gifts to receive is expensive perfume. If you buy cheap perfume, it often doesn't smell very nice or it doesn't last very long. I live with my mom and Grandma in an apartment block in the city. I love going to school each day with my friends from our building. My friends know everything about me. We love hanging out together and having fun. We love slurpees, candy and talking about clothes and looking for the latest hairstyles online. Middle School isn't as bad as I thought it was going to be.

Last year in Miss Penny's class we talked about the kind of people we want to be and what we want to be remembered for. It reminded me of something that had happened to my friends and me.

Each day we get our lunch from the school cafeteria. The servers are known

for being, well, let's just say it, grumpy. One day, a new worker started. She was so happy to be working. You could tell because she was always smiling. Fiona was a lovely lady and was always kind. She became known among the students as "Happy Fiona". By looking at her, you would think that she was the happiest person in the world. Miss Penny asked my friends and me to interview "Happy Fiona" for the school newspaper. So we arranged an interview. What we learned shocked us. She told us her story. She had grown up without any parents and spent her life in foster care. At the age of 15 she ran away and lied about her age. She worked in diners and restaurants as a waitress and got married pretty young. Her marriage was good and she was happy, but her husband was killed in a car accident when she was pregnant with their first child. When her baby arrived, she was so lonely and lost. She turned to her local church for help, and said "Yes!" to Jesus. She finally had the family she had dreamt of her whole life. Fiona could never dream of having so many people to love her. She hadn't felt joy like that before. She determined that everywhere she was, she would let the joy she felt show on her face.

My friends and I came away from that interview so challenged. Fiona wanted to be known as a person full of Joy, and she was. She had every reason to give up and surrender to her circumstances, but instead she chose Joy. Her everyday choice to smile at the future, not only affected her own son, but many others as she served in local school cafeterias.

My friends and I submitted our article to Miss Penny, and then we decided to do something special for Happy Fiona. We sold lollipops at school and used the money to buy her a lovely card and some flowers to say, "thanks for brightening our day with your smile". It was the first time I had ever seen her cry, haha.

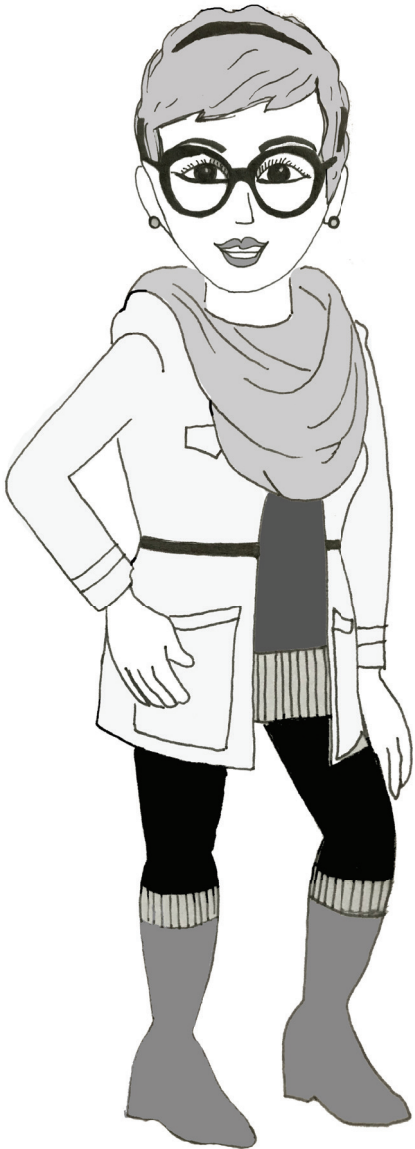
I want to be known for the good things I do, just like Fiona.

Proverbs 20:11 says that, "Even small children are known by their actions." Good or Bad. What you repeat, will be what you are known for. Okay, it's time to learn how to make sure we are representing Jesus well in ALL we do and say.

THE BIGGEST SANDCASTLE IN THE WORLD

Obedience



Okay friends, let's grab some shovels and buckets and head to the beach! I love to make sandcastles, but I hate watching the tide come in and destroy my creation. So sad!

The biggest sandcastle according to the Guinness Book of Records was built in India on February 10, 2017. It took 45 people to build a staggering 14.84 meters (48 foot 8 inches) tall castle with a base circumference of 161.54 meters (530 feet). Picture yourself being on the fifth floor of a hotel and looking down. That's how high it was! This gigantic castle was made entirely by hand (no big machines) and took nine days. Just for fun, you may want to google sandcastles and see more enormous ones!

As gigantic as this castle was, no one could ever live in it and that's the point of Jesus' words today. Anyone can build a house on the sand (a foolish builder) or on the rock (a wise builder). The choice is yours.

Obedience is pretty high on Jesus' list!

He watered and fertilized it again in year two...nothing was seen. Year four and year five came and went, still nothing.

In the fifth year something extraordinary happened. The bamboo tree sprouted and grew up to 24.38 meters (80 feet). It was the tallest tree in the whole neighborhood and Jim was the gardening hero on Cutler Road! Through all these years the tree was growing underground and the root system grew strong first.

You have a 'root system' too. It's about being hidden in Christ. The Bible tells us we need to 'die' to our selfish desires and let Him work in the secret places in our lives.

Well, my Lectio friends, let's dive deep into some good theology today!

Did you know that more than 160,000 school children stay home from school every day because they are afraid of being bullied? These kids (and you may be one of them) feel small and hate themselves. For many, the problem does not “go away.”

Jesus was bullied when he was slapped on the face by the guard of the High Priest. He did not turn His face so the guard could slap him again. Instead Jesus replied, “Have I said something wrong?. If I have, give witness to it. But if I spoke the truth, why did you hit me?” He confronted the bully and demanded an answer for His unjust treatment. Jesus was not mean, but He was assertive.

Did you know that Joseph, Moses, David, Shadrach, Meshach, Abednego and many others in the Bible were all bullied? God does not approve of anyone bullying any child or adult.

My dear Lectio Divina friends, I am praying today for your protection. If you see someone being bullied, God is probably asking you to pray for him or her and to be a friend who is loyal to them.

It is especially important to read this scripture and to read it with confidence in a loud, slow voice, declaring God’s heart of protection and care for you.

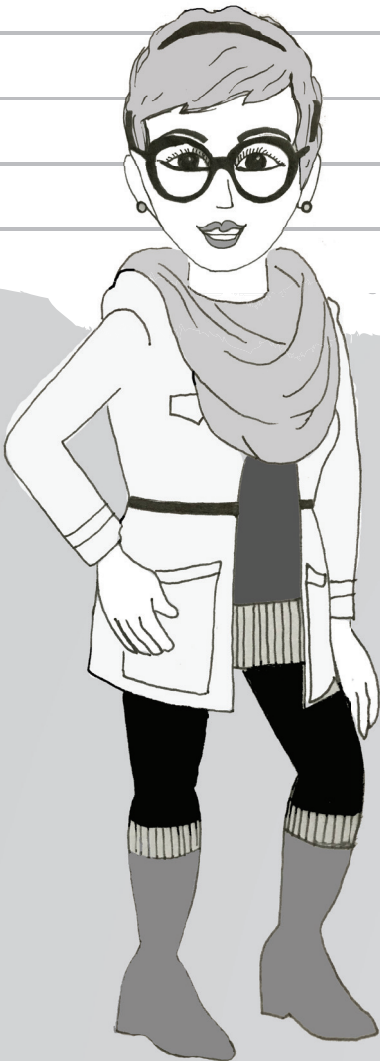

3. You want to be rescued, but you don't want the Captain to run every voyage of your life. So you say NO, to the Captain.

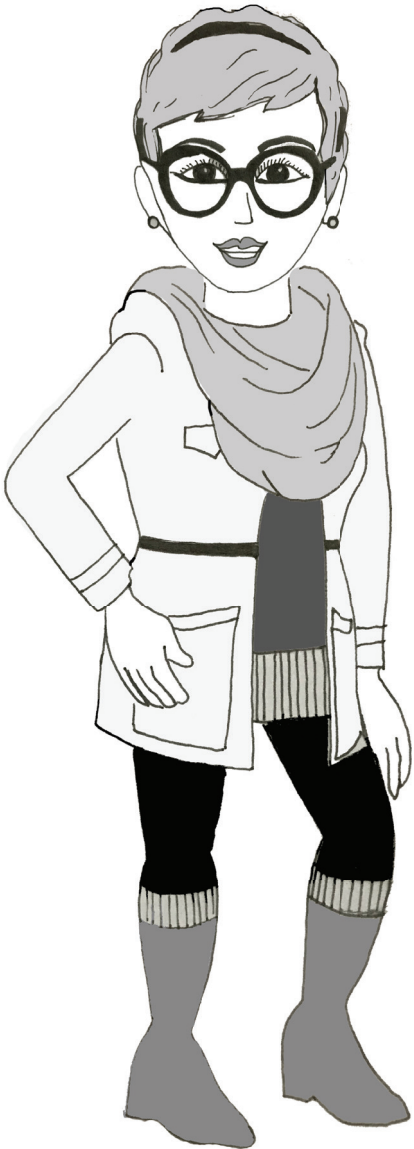

Deborah is a name that means "busy bee"! She lived 1,400 years before Jesus and was a prophetess, judge, and a great leader. Deborah told Barak, a general in the Israeli army, that God was going to give the army a big victory over their enemy and He would go ahead of them. That was a prophecy God gave to her.

How did this happen? Deborah and Barak sang a song of praise together to the Lord after the BIG victory. God sent a flood and the chariots of the enemy's army got stuck in the mud. That's how the Israeli army won! Wow! All because God sent His word to Deborah and she gave it to Barak! I can't wait to hear what God is saying to you today.

My dad's in the Navy and we move around quite a bit. I love that my dad is in the Navy. Our family loves the water and snorkelling in the ocean. But being a Navy Kid, means sometimes my dad is gone or we have to move every couple of years. I've kind of gotten used to travelling to different places by now. But having to pack up my stuff into boxes and leave my friends behind doesn't get easier. The feeling of saying goodbye is hard. I can be a little shy at times, so making friends can be tricky. Trusting people can be even harder.

My parents had been really praying for me and my little sister to settle into our new place. I was 10yrs. old at the time and really angry that we had to move again for the third time. That's when I met Miss Penny.

School started okay, but I didn't want to be the "new kid". I wanted to be the "old kid". Learning new routines and meeting new people was hard. It seemed so unfair. Because I was upset, I chose not to trust anyone. My parents would tell me to "lean on Jesus", but I didn't really understand how I could "lean" on someone I couldn't see. A grin came across Miss Penny's face, "What a great answer, Christy. Sometimes when we don't know if we can trust God, we can look and see others we know and love, who have put their trust in Him. And we know that if God can handle their problems, then He can handle ours. God wants us to lean on Him and trust Him with our lives. He is strong enough to guide us on the best pathway."

When Miss Penny said that, I remembered when my mom was saying goodbye to her friends at the Naval base. 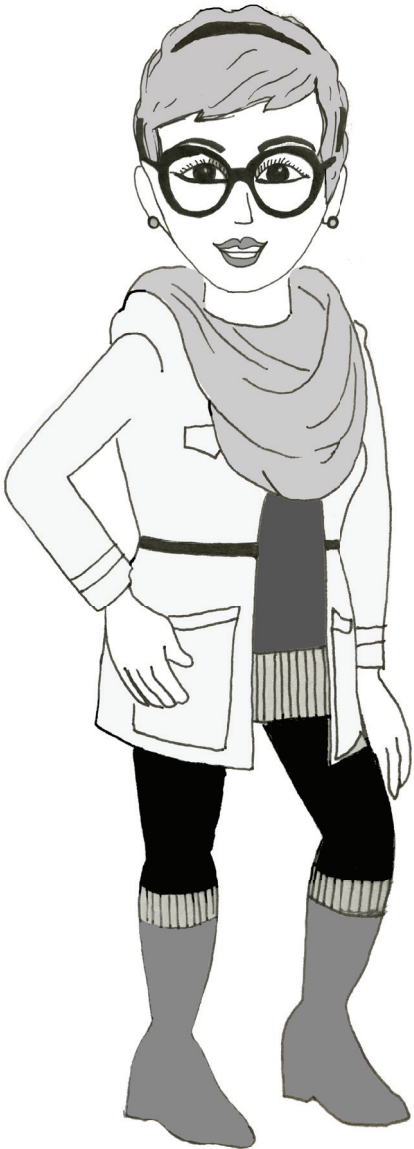

- Emotion tears flow when you are sad or happy and calm the iris in your eyes.

You are not being a "baby" when you cry. Trust God that He made your tears for a purpose.

Daniel loved God and would only bow down to the one true God. The wicked leaders tricked the king to declare that anyone who did not bow to him would be thrown into the lions' den. Daniel loved God only and yes, was thrown to the hungry lions. That night the king could not sleep and you will read below what happened when he checked in on Daniel the next morning.

Probably not, but perhaps you heard some stories about how you took a step, then fell down, took more steps, and fell again, and then took a bunch of steps and kept going. That's what trusting God is like, taking baby steps, then bigger steps and long jumps!

You will discover today some steps to take on your personal "trust journey with God".

HOW A LITTLE TURNED INTO A LOT

Complaining doesn't get us anywhere



It's so easy to complain, complain, complain! Complaining never gets us anywhere. We complain about how little we have, rather than seeing what God can do with a little bit of something. Wait till you hear about a widow in 2 Kings 4. Her husband died. He loved God, but when he died he owed money to someone. The poor widow did not have the money, so that person was taking her two sons to be his slaves. How sad is that?

Elisha, the prophet, showed up and asked her what she had in her home. "I have nothing, only a tiny bit of olive oil", she said hopelessly. Elisha told her to ask her neighbors for jars, many jars, and when she collected them she was to go inside her home with her sons and fill the jars up with oil from the little oil she had.

Let's see what happened and what God is saying to you about 'trust' today.

2 Kings 4:5-7

The woman left him. After that, she shut the door behind her and her sons. They brought the jars to her. And she kept pouring. When all of the jars were full, she spoke to one of her sons. She said, "Bring me another jar." But he replied, "There aren't any more left." Then the oil stopped flowing. She went and told the man of God about it. He said, "Go and sell the oil. Pay what you owe. You and your sons can live on what is left."

GOD MADE ME TO BE BRAVE

He is always with me



I was a fifth grade teacher for four years. I loved teaching kids and seeing them grow and learn. I remember all my students, especially Barry. He won my heart. On many days I noticed Barry didn't eat his lunch because he said he had stomach aches. He stayed in often from recess with a headache or other problems. A couple weeks passed and I knew I had to talk with Barry and his mom to see what the problem was and how I might help him.

What we discovered still makes me very sad. There was a 6th grade boy, RJ, who every morning made fun of Barry and took his lunch money. He said if Barry gave him his money he would be his friend and because Barry wanted his friendship he gave him money every day. Some days Barry would ask his mom for more money to give to RJ, but instead of being friends, RJ called Barry bad names and threatened to beat him up if he didn't get him the money. This was a definitely a bullying situation.

Because Barry was scared of getting beat up, he isolated himself from everyone, including his friends. Here is a statistic I found: if 100 children are together and they all see somebody being bullied, 89 of them would do nothing, because bullies scare all of them. But if they get together, 2, 3 or more, and report it to an adult, something can be done. A student who is being bullied needs a friend like you and your friends to tell. Our school counselor said when friends tell, more kids feel safe.

Did you know Goliath bullied David and God gave him supernatural strength to beat Goliath? And Saul in the New Testament bullied the Christians until Jesus stepped in and stopped him in a vision. I am praying for you, your school and neighborhood. God designed you to be strong and courageous. He has given you and your friends special gifts. No bully can take those away!

GOD SEES ME

Trust that God knows me



I was teaching a class one day, and one of my students got upset with another classmate and ran away. I watched him run and hide in the sandpit at the back of the school. I knew where he was, but he thought I couldn't see him. When our eyes finally locked on each other, and he knew I saw him, we started talking and he came back to class.

It reminds me of a Bible character called Hagar. You can find her story in Genesis 16. She was mistreated by her boss and was so upset she ran away. Have you ever felt like that? Sometimes things can feel overwhelming and we're not too sure how to cope with them. But in the hot desert, an angel found her and told her what God wanted her to do. At the end of the conversation, Hagar said, "You are the God who sees me." He saw her trouble and cared enough to send someone to tell her what God wanted to say.

It's the same for you and for me.

God sees us and he wants to talk with us. Let Him talk to you today as you reflect on the psalmist's words in Psalm 139.

Scripture:

Psalm 139:1-2

Lord, you have seen what is in my heart. You know all about me. You know when I sit down and when I get up. You know what I'm thinking even though you are far away.

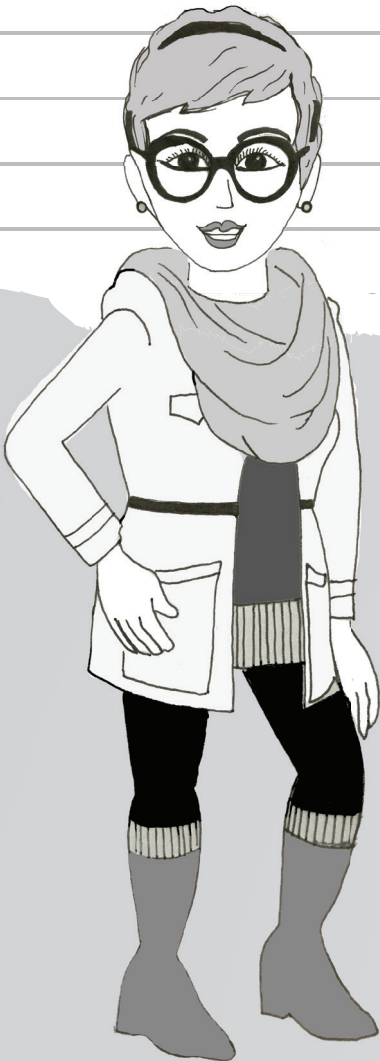

1. Say this prayer out aloud:

I know that Jesus rose from the dead and is coming back someday. Please forgive me of all of my sins, and come into my life and change me. Please guide me in my life and help me to follow you. Thank you for saving me and taking me to heaven when I die. In Jesus' Name, Amen.
